#### **Lockdown Procedures**

A few weeks ago you may have heard about a lockdown that happened at one of the local high schools and primary schools. At Star we have a lockdown policy and procedures that is available on the website. As with any form of safety procedure, we will often test this out so that if there was ever a need to put this plan into action, the children and staff would be best prepared. Staff have received training and we have formulated a child friendly approach to the lockdown plan at STAR. Firstly we will change the wording from lockdown to:-

FS1-Y3 – Huddle Story Time

Y4-Y6 - Friendly Shelter Time

Staff have read a story to the children and have explained that as for a fire drill we need to practice so that we can be safe here at STAR. We have practiced saying "I'm not scared..... I'm prepared!!!"

In the event of a lockdown parents will be informed via a text message. Please do not call the academy as all phone lines need to be kept free. This is the message you will receive:

## the academy is in a full lockdown situation. During this period the switchboard and entrances will be un-manned, external doors locked and nobody allowed in or out...'

Depending on the type and severity of the incident, parents may be asked NOT to collect their children from the academy as it may put them and their child at risk.

Pupils will not be released to parents during a lock down.

If the end of the day is extended due to the lock down, parents will be notified and will receive information about the time and place pupils can be picked up from office staff or emergency services.

A letter to parents will be sent home on the nearest possible day following any serious incident to inform parents of context of lockdown and to encourage parents to reinforce with their children the importance of following procedures in these very rare circumstances.
