#### From September 2019

Due to health and Safety, we will be making some changes from September 2019:

**Bags and equipment** - Please only buy a book bag for your child as we will not be allowing big rucksacks into school as we do not have the room to safely store them.

Children are provided with all equipment and therefore pencil cases are not needed.

**PE** - Children will come into school in their school uniform every day. They will need to bring their PE kit into school in a draw string bag as these can easily be hung on pegs.

We ask that they bring their kit in on a Monday and take it home to be washed on a Friday. Please see the uniform list as correct PE kit is required.

### School is closed to pupils on Thursday May 23rd due to European elections


#### SMART children are SMART learners.
