From September 2019

Due to health and Safety, we will be making some changes from September 2019:

Bags and equipment - Please only buy a book bag for your child as we will not be allowing big rucksacks into school as we do not have the room to safely store them.

Children are provided with all equipment and therefore pencil cases are not needed.

PE - Children will come into school in their school uniform every day. They will need to bring their PE kit into school in a draw string bag as these can easily be hung on pegs.

We ask that they bring their kit in on a Monday and take it home to be washed on a Friday. Please see the uniform list as correct PE kit is required.

EYFS Uniform

Children in Nursery and Reception do not need to wear a shirt and tie, they can wear a white school polo shirt.

Term Time Holidays

We will be following government procedure for holidays. This means that if you take your child out of school for holidays then there is a high possibility that you will be fined. Please consider this before booking any holidays during term time.

SMART children are SMART learners.

We understand that sometimes, shoes break and ties can be lost. However, it is really important to us that children remain smart at all times.

From September we will have some uniform in stock which children will be expected to wear for the day should they not have the correct uniform.

Trainers – will be changed for black pumps

Ties – will be loaned for the day

PE Kit – white T-shirts and black shorts/leggings/tracksuits will be expected. If children wear the wrong colour or do not have kit then we will loan them clean kit for the lesson. All items will be left in school at the end of the day.

Morning Entrances

Reception and Nursery – will enter the building from their playgrounds and adults will be by the doors.

Years 1,2,3 and 4 will enter through the main doors on the KS1 playground.

Years 5 and 6 will enter through the Community Library door.

Mrs Williams (our new Home School Link Worker) and a member of Senior Leadership will be out in the mornings for you to speak to.
