### Absence procedures

Please make sure that you contact the Academy every day during your child's absence. We have a legal duty of care to follow up if we do not receive a call to provide us with a reason for your child being off school.

If we have not been provided with a reason for absence the following takes place:-

- Call to parents and if no response then calls to all other contacts.
- Text message to parents.
- If no response then request Educational Welfare Officer to do a home visit.
- Designated Safeguarding Lead and Home School Link Worker advised.
- On pupil's return to school a letter will be sent home requesting reason for absence slip to be completed and returned.

We work really hard to make sure that we provide your child with the very best experiences at Star Academy. However, there may be a time when you are unhappy about the provision and would like to make a complaint.
