

School attendance is important for a child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development.

Evidence shows that students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results.

Establishing good attendance patterns from an early age can help children later on in life.

When children attend school consistently, they are more likely to do well in their work and build strong relationships with the school community.

Parents are legally responsible for making sure that children go to school.

Why is good attendance and punctuality important?

Education lays the vital foundations of a child's life. Regular and punctual attendance at school is key to both academic and social development, which in turn will improve the life chances of children and young people.

Authorised or Unauthorised?

If your child is ill, school will need details of their illness. If the reasons for the absence are made known to us, and are appropriate, the absence will be authorised for the first few days. If their illness continues, you may be asked for evidence from your GP. However, school will not authorise non-attendance for illness, if it becomes too frequent. If your child's attendance falls below 90% (persistent absentee), you will also be asked for medical evidence in order to authorise the absence.

Holiday Taking

Holidays in term time will have a detrimental effect on your child's progress, as they miss chunks of their learning. In line with Star Academy's policy, we will not authorise any holiday in term time.

Unauthorised Absences

If your child has a number of unauthorised absences, you are at risk of receiving a penalty notice (fine) from the local authority.



ATTENDANCE FACTS

Above 97% Less than 6 days absence a year! Excellent attendance! Pupils with this attendance should achieve the best grades they can.


95% Less than 10 days absence in a year! Pupils with this attendance are more likely to achieve their target grades

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
90% 20 days absence over the year! Pupils with this attendance are missing approximately a month (20 days) of school per year and may fall behind in Maths, English and other subjects; it will be difficult for them to achieve their best.

85% 30 days absence in a year! These pupils are missing approximately 6 weeks of school a year! It will be very difficult for them to keep up and achieve their best.

80% Pupils with this attendance are missing a day for every week of school! It will be almost impossible to keep up with their work. Parents of pupils with this level of attendance will be well known to the Education Welfare Officer. Your child's attendance will be closely monitored







Meet our Assistant Principal and Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL)



Mrs Lewis

A Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) is a person appointed to make sure that schools adhere to their statutory safeguarding policies and duties.

The role of the DSL was specified in the <u>Children Act 2004</u>, stating that every organisation that works with children should have a role dedicated to safeguarding. It's a responsibility that holds both strategic duties within the organisation's frameworks and campaigns, as well as having day-to-day duties to undertake.

Mrs Lewis has been the safeguarding lead at Star for a number of years and her role includes,

- attending meetings with the local authority
- collecting children's views
- training staff on all safeguarding updates
- overseeing early help meetings to ensure parents have the support that they need both at home and at school
- discussing any safeguarding concerns with parents
- ensuring that all pupils feel safe when they are at school.

Mrs Lewis also leads online safety, attendance, culture and behaviour across the school.

POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS APPS PARENTS / TEACHERS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT

THESE APPS CAN EASILY BE USED AS GROOMING TOOLS BY ONLINE PREDATORS LOOKING TO MEET UP & SEXUALLY ABUSE CHILDREN.

This is not exhaustive, and updated each year to reflect new risks and dangers (updated 2022). New apps are constantly being created, so it's important to monitor what children download



others and share comments, photos and videos. You can add friends, write on people's pages and posts, join groups and play games.



WHATSAPP Allows you to send messages, images and videos in 121 and group chats with your contacts. You can choose to share your live location for up to eight hours with one contact or a group.



WHISPER Is an anonymous social is an anonymous social media app that promotes sharing personal secrets with strangers, (new people). It reveals a users location so people can meet up.



Ann app where users can anonymously ask questions and receive answers. The app has been featured in a number of cyber bullying



WISHBONE This app allows users to compare kids and rate them on a scale.



Anonymous messenger app. It calls itself "the most honest place on the internet." Age controls are inconsistent and sexual explicit material can be

FACEROOK MESSENGER



Is one of the most popular message apps in the world. It has already heavily been used by predators and the end-to end encryption will make it even more unsafe.



Allows users to watch and post six second videos. While many of the videos are harmless, porn videos do pop up into the feed, exposing your children to sexually explicit material.



Hoop is a dating app that connects to SnapChat and allows 12 + teens to swipe on pictures that they like with the purpose of meeting. This leads to issues with fraud and sexual predators.
