Meet Mrs Niemczyk

Mrs Niemczyk was previously the Vice Principal, before becoming Principal at Sun Academy, Bradwell.

She now works as an Executive Trust Principal supporting Star and all of the other ATT primary academies.

Following your feedback in the parent survey, we be inviting Mrs Niemczyk to some of our parent events. Mrs Niemczyk is very knowledgeable about SEND, Early Years, Phonics and assessment.

Uniform Reminder

All children are expected to be in the full, correct uniform every day. This includes plain black shoes and a school PE kit.

Please ensure that all uniform has your child's full name clearly labelled in it - the back of the badge is a good place to use for jumpers. We have numerous uniform that goes missing daily and we are unable to locate or find jumpers, cardigans etc if they are not clearly labelled with your child's name to identify it as theirs.

Children can wear a pair of stud earrings but any hoop earrings, rings, bracelets, necklaces and gel/stick on nails are not permitted for health and safety reasons as if these get caught outside on the equipment they pose a serious injury risk. Earring should be removed before school on swimming and PE days - if your child wears earrings on a PE or swimming day they will need to remove them by themselves and be responsible for looking after them. Staff are not allowed to remove earrings nor be accountable for looking after them

Non Uniform Days

As a Trust, all schools have adopted a more inclusive approach when celebrating and raising awareness of our special days. Many children and parents view non-uniform days as a treat a day off from having to wear their shoes and school jumpers. For some, it's an opportunity to show off their best clothes and fashion sense

Sadly, however, for others it's a day that makes them anxious and nervous about coming to school. They're scared about others judging them on their clothing and this can then lead to children not attending school. Children shouldn't be missing out on their education over concerns about their appearance so we will no longer have non-uniform days and will instead celebrate in other ways so everyone can take part

Safeguarding

At Star, we take safeguarding very seriously and ensure at all times that your child is safe and happy.

Our Designated Safeguarding Lead is Mrs Lewis, who is our Assistant Principal. Our Deputy Safeguarding Lead is Mrs Bloor, the Principal and Mrs Eptlett and Mrs Williams, who are our Additional Designated Safeguarding Leads. If you have any concerns, please speak to one of the team.

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
