We wish Mrs Eptlett every success and happiness in her new adventure.






Why does Attendance matter?




There is a clear link between poor attendance at school and lower academic achievement, in a nutshell – how can our children learn if they are not here?

- A child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life
- Poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable
- Poor school attendance is also closely associated with crime - a quarter of school age offenders have truanted repeatedly

TYPES CHILD ABUSE

There are four common types of abuse:



PHYSICAL ABUSE

The non-accidental physical injury of a child. The inadvertent result of physical punishment or physically aggressive treatment of a child.



SEXUAL ABUSE

Any act of sexual nature upon or with a child for the sexual gratification of the perpetrator or a third party, including anyone who allowed or encouraged it.



EMOTIONAL ABUSE

Chronic attitudes or acts which interfere with the psychological and social development of a child. When a parent or caregiver harms a child's mental and social development or causes severe emotional harm.



NEGLECT

Child-rearing practices which are essentially inadequate or dangerous. The failure to act on behalf of the child; not providing the care, supervision, affection, and support needed for a child's health, safety, and well-being.

Safeguarding is about protecting children from harm and ensuring their well-being. Any form of abuse—whether physical, emotional, sexual, or neglect—is a serious safeguarding concern. It's our responsibility to recognise the signs and take action to keep children safe. No concern is too small when it comes to a child's safety.
